Travel Advice for New Guests and Veterans

Over the years CMH has developed a few principles to guide guests through the transition from home to heli-ski lodge. Always:

- Carry your passport.
- Carry-on your ski boots.
- Limit luggage to 18kg/40lbs.
- Advise the CMH Transportation Team of any changes to your travel itinerary.

Upon arriving at Calgary International Airport please collect your luggage and proceed across the street to the Delta Calgary Airport Hotel. There you will be greeted by a CMH representative and given specific instructions.

Late arriving guests or mid-week arrivals should also proceed to the Delta Calgary Airport Hotel where you will be met by a CMH representative or pre-arranged car and

driver to continue your journey into the lodges.

Guests arriving via Kelowna, Prince George, Vancouver or other way-points need to be in contact with the CMH Transportation Team prior to arriving and upon arrival at the airport so that CMH may monitor your progress and travel arrangements.

Passport Control

A VALID PASSPORT IS REQUIRED FOR ENTRY INTO CANADA.

If you arrive in Canada from a foreign country, including the United States of America, you must clear Canadian Customs and will be required to produce a valid passport (in some cases, a driver's license and birth certificate will suffice, however check with authorities before leaving your home).

If you have been convicted of a criminal offence, you may be denied entry into Canada. Contact the Canadian Border Services Agency prior to your departure for more information regarding your official status. You may require a legal pardon from your country or some such docu-

ment to gain entry into Canada.

If you are denied entry into Canada at the port of entry, please notify CMH of your delay and contact your attorney for advice.

CMH at the Delta Calgary Airport Hotel

Representatives from Canadian Mountain Holidays may be found in the lobby of the Delta Calgary Airport Hotel on Fridays and Saturdays for trips beginning on the weekend; and on certain days during the week to facilitate scheduled mid-week heli-ski trips.

Upon arriving in Calgary, please present yourself to the representatives for a cheerful welcome and specific instructions for continuing on to the lodges.

In the unfortunate circumstance of lost luggage, please file a claim with the airline and repeat the in-

formation to the CMH representative who may monitor the situation and assist with your luggage recovery. CMH will make every effort to forward your luggage to the lodge, however additional expenses may be incurred by the guest and applied to their tripbill.

Transportation To and From the Areas

Transportation from Calgary via Banff to the area lodges covers an enormous amount of land of varied geography. You will travel from the flat prairie surrounding Calgary, through the rolling foothills of the Front Range and into the heart of the majestic Canadian Rockies. Your journey will expose you to winter driving conditions which may involve snow, ice,

wind, cold temperatures and low visibility, all factors that contribute to the best skiing in the world. For these reasons your patience and cooperation, while enroute to the lodges, is appreciated and will be greatly rewarded during your stay at the lodges.

Every effort is made to maintain a strict travel schedule while travel-

ing to and from the lodges. However, your journey is at the mercy of the weather and road conditions. Please plan accordingly when arranging your travel itinerary. Do not rely on unrealistic travel connections and avoid disappointment by allowing yourself enough time to complete your journey in less than ideal weather conditions.

Adamant Ground Transportation Schedule

About 350 kilometres west of Banff, Adamant Lodge is spectacularly situated at the confluence of four major alpine valleys. It's named for a majestic collection of diamond-hard peaks, a subrange of the Selkirks, where we do all our Adamants based Heli-Skiing. The Selkirks are famed for long glaciers, deep valleys, and rugged vistas. Their excellent tree skiing and huge, open glacier terrain make the Adamants one of our most popular areas.

The Adamants Lodge is a fly-in lodge and is situated at the end of the arduous Goldstream Road. The road is not maintained beyond the Adamants helipad at the 16km/9.9mile mark. It is therefore recommended that all guests use the ground transportation supplied by CMH and inclusive in the trip price.

Guests requiring special transportation arrangements should con-

tact the Special Transportation Coordinator for assistance. Accessing the Adamant lodge after the regularly scheduled exchange time or leaving a trip early may result in additional helicopter transfer and car and driver fees.

The timing for Adamant guests hoping to take part in the Powder Air program does not work. Alternatives do, however, exist for Adamant guests to fly into Revelstoke airport, please contact the CMH Transportation Team for details.

Drive along Hwy. #23, and turn right on the Goldstream road.....90km/56miles

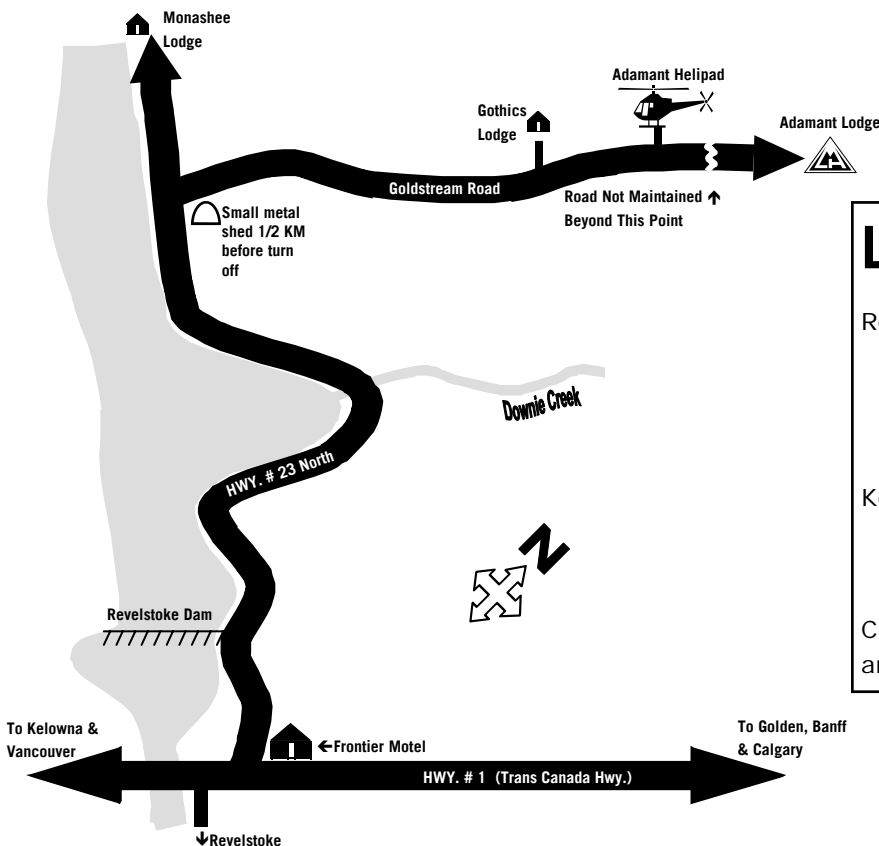
The helipad is on the left at 16km/9.9miles.

Powder Air Services

Powder Air will once again be providing flight services from Calgary airport to the towns of Revelstoke and Valemount . Flight operations are intended to service the CMH lodges of Revelstoke, Gothics, Monashees, Cariboos and Valemount. Following on the heels of last year's great success, this year Powder Air will be using the venerable Dash-8 airplane to make its powder runs. Powder Air makes getting to the CMH heli-ski areas faster and easier with flights leaving from Calgary mid-morning on Saturday and arriving in Revelstoke and Valemount approximately one hour and fifteen minutes later. The planes will be met by dedicated ground transportation for quick shuttles to the CMH lodge of your choice. Powder Air is designed to save you time, so you can relax.
